

Looking back on 2020 with gratitude

It has been a year that perhaps none of us would choose to repeat and yet, as I look back, my over-whelming emotion is gratitude.

For the nearly 26 years since our grand opening on May 27, 1995, and the four years before that while the dream of A Carousel for Missoula was being realized, our Carousel community has responded with generosity and ingenuity to every request for support we could throw at it. This year was no exception. In March, we made the difficult decision to close the Carousel and Dragon Hollow to help control the spread of COVID-19. The board and staff initially thought a 10-day closure might be enough to do our part. As case counts rose, however, it was apparent our closure would go on for some time.

After some soul searching and much research, we reopened Dragon Hollow in early July, but the Carousel has remained closed and we do not yet have an anticipated reopening date. We enter 2021 in an operational limbo, but we are confident that your support will sustain us during our extended closure, and will allow us to be ready to reopen quickly when the board and the Missoula County Health Department determine it is safe to do so.

Along with no concrete reopening date, we also do not have solid information about the state of our regular events. Will it be safe to hold the Fairy Tale and Superhero Festival in late July, or Haunted Hollow around Halloween? Can we host a hybrid Garden Party in September, combining in-person guests with others attending virtually? Will Santa be able to have breakfast at the Carousel in December? So many questions, and no definitive answers.

When we train new employees, and at all of our employee meetings throughout the year, we talk about the key words in each facet of Carousel operations. The key word for the Gift Shop, for instance, is helpful. The key word for the platform is, and always has been, safety. In prior times, that has meant making sure our riders get on and off the horses safely, staying vigilant during rides, and ensuring that guests stay safe whenever they are in the building. Since March 15, it has meant no rides at all.

Obviously, we can't tell you when we will be able to reopen, or what events we will be able to hold this year, but as we make those decisions, safety is our guiding factor.

While we wait to see what the future holds, we look back on 2020 with gratitude to all of you for all you have done for us. The remainder of this newsletter is a testimonial to <u>you</u>, and <u>you</u>, and <u>you</u>, and <u>each one of you</u> who has helped sustain us these many years.

If you do not find your name listed for some donation you have made or service you have provided, please accept my apologies, and let me know. I will be sure to include that information in a future newsletter. We want to be sure to acknowledge your support so others know of your kindness, but we also want never to forget how strongly this community supports our efforts.


